

END OF LIFE NURSING EDUCATION CONSORTIUM (ELNEC)- VETERAN

This two-day live virtual course is designed for healthcare clinicians and community members caring for Veterans facing serious or life limiting illness. The programwill provide the learner with the competence and confidence to provide optimal care to Veterans and families facing end of life. Course content includes eight educational modules including Palliative Nursing Care; Pain Management; Symptom Management; Communication; Culture and Spirituality; Final Hours; Loss, Grief, and Bereavement; Self-Care and Resilience.
